The New York Fire Department (FDNY) has contracted with First Responders Disability Awareness Training with the intent to develop and eventually deliver the Firefighter/Emergency

NU FR-DAT to Roll-Out New York State Emergency Management Disability Awareness Training

As devastating hurricanes rip through the Caribbeans and the South, we are again reminded of the importance to be prepared and ensure the planning process adheres to all individuals. The grant from the New York State Developmental Disabilities Planning Council took a big step forward this month when it unveiled the program at the New York Association on Independent Living conference (Troy, NY) with a preview session held at Access for Independence (Cortland, NY).

The premise will be specialists trained in Inclusive Planning and Active Participation, as well as individuals with disabilities and access and functional needs versed in what active participation entails. Emergency Management offices across NYS will be educated as to how the process works, connect with specialists and active participants who will have responsibilities, receive a functional working manual, and be trained in all aspects of access and functional needs.

The program will debut on campus November 29-30, with subsequent sessions established across New York in 2018.


