# Arkansas Governor's Developmental Disabilities Council the FIRST to fund FRDAT outside of New York State

The Arkansas Governor's Developmental Disabilities Council (DDC) has agreed to bring First Responder Disability

Awareness Training to their state. Initial funding will be for one year with the intent to cover three years to fully ensure complete rollout of the program across all first responder disciplines.

### Ongoing progress enhances program



You will notice improvements with our website as it has beenembedded within NU's website - <a href="frdat.niagara.edu">frdat.niagara.edu</a>. New forms have been added under the Contact Us tab. Reference our website for the latest news, tools, videos, trainings, and resources.

The EMS online training is in full development with production scheduled to be completed by summer's end. FRDAT will be in the studio the last week of June. NU is also in discussion with the **Center for Healthcare Education** to secure certification.

FRDAT also completed two film shoots this month. One will show law enforcement how to properly frisk an individual who uses a wheelchair, to include where to look in a wheelchair for weapons, contraband, or stolen goods. The other video demonstrates how a sitto-stand power wheelchair operates. This will enhance the durable medical equipment video already found in the Train the Trainer program.

#### Intern research

**Ally Jones**, Social Work intern, is currently researching both mental health courts and developmentally disabled offender courts across the country. This information will be used to identify best practices and assist in development of courts in jurisdictions that do not specifically have this option.

**Marina Dibartolomeo**, Sociology/Criminal Justice intern, is researching learning disability and incarceration. LD is identified as the disability that law enforcement encounters the most. Further research is being conducted to better understand both the implications of this and what needs to be done to address the issue.

FRDAT will be bringing in two Marketing student interns to develop the marketing plan for national outreach. This will be done in conjunction with previous marketing research, conducted by the Carr consulting firm.
