On May 8th, Project Director David Whalen was invited to present to the **100 Club of Buffalo** (www.100clubbuffalo.org), an organization that assists families of fallen first responders or first responders injured in the line of duty. The French Connection room at Chef's restaurant was filled to capacity and the program was very well received.

To date, 282 first responders from 159 different fire, EMS, and law enforcement departments have gone through the Train the Trainer program.
