Project Director Named Disability Advocate of the Year by Deaf Access Services

Project Director Dave Whalen was named **Advocate of the Year for 2016** by [Western New York Deaf Access Services \(DAS\)](#). Whalen received the award at the DAS Spring Gala on April 15.

"We recognize and appreciate your kindness and generous support of our organization and the people we serve," wrote board president Michael Cross in a congratulatory letter. Through the NU FRDAT program, DAS and Dave have developed over 200 ASL signs for first responders, created the Deaf/Hard of Hearing curriculum in the Disability Awareness Training program, and recently created an informational video on the value of video remote interpreting when first responders are interacting with people who use ASL.

NENA Signs Agreement with NU FRDAT

National Emergency Numbers Association (NENA) and NU FRDAT signed an agreement that establishes a collaborative relationship between the two entities. NENA now recognizes NU FRDAT's **911 Dispatch Disability Awareness Training**

New York State Justice Center Signs Agreement with NU FRDAT

NU FRDAT and the **New York State Justice Center for the Protection of People with Special Needs** have entered into a three year working agreement that enhances the law enforcement disability awareness training in the state of New York. The purpose of the relationship is to support the Justice Center's ability to conduct regular law enforcement trainings for local departments and officers.



It also calls for the NU FRDAT Project Director to provide insight and expertise to the Justice Center on matters relative to proper response to victims with developmental disabilities. This would include personnel training and more enhanced curriculum development, such as investigator interviewing.
