Inaugural First Responder Disability Awareness Missouri Advisory Council held



The first Missouri Advisory Council was held in Columbia, Missouri on March 28th. Representatives form Kansas City Fire Department MissouriState Police FBI Missouri EMS Association, Commission for the Deaf, The ADA Center, Missouri Governors Council on Disabilities, Self Advocates Becoming Empowered (SABE), Missouri Family Education on Autism Treatment (FETE), Missouri Tourette Syndrome Association, Missouri Office of Emergency Management, and other key players were in attendance. Members discussed and collaborated on the next steps to building the Missouri specific Disability Awareness Training curriculum for all categories of first responders. The input collected was extremely in depth and the knowledge of those who participating was enlightening and essential in completing this task.



Double amputee Marine to join Suffolk County Police

On March 24, 2017, Matias Ferreira was sworn into Suffolk County Police Department, and is believed to be the first fully active double-amputee police officer in the United States. Ferreira is

a veteran who lost his legs during a tour of duty in Afghanistan in 2011. Ferreira had always dreamed of being a Police Officer and states "I'm just really eager and excited to prove myself to my colleagues in my new job, my new career, that I'm capable of doing the job just as well as somebody with both legs,"(Newsday). "This is someone who served our nation, paid a significant sacrifice, and is now able to overcome adversity in a tremendous way," Sini said. "He's done a terrific job as a recruit in the academy, both physically, academically and in his leadership to the other recruits, and he's going to make a fine officer." (Newsday 3/25/17)
