**New York State Developmental Disabilities Planning Council Awards NU-FRDAT Emergency Management Grant**

The Niagara University First Responders Disability Awareness

Training program has been awarded the New York State Developmental Disabilities Planning Council (DDPC) Emergency Management Grant. Objectives include training for emergency management personnel and establish core advisory groups that represent the disability community in an active role in the planning, preparedness, response, and recovery process.

The three year grant will allow for development of a training curriculum that addresses all areas of need for both emergency management personnel and individuals with disabilities, to include a comprehensive curriculum.

### **Disability Awareness Training in Montana a Success**

Dave was in Helena, Montana in mid-October, providing the Train the Trainer program for all four disciplines. In total four FF/EMS, six 911 Dispatch, and 16 police officers are now trainers. The law enforcement training and the 911 dispatch training have been approved for Montana's POST accreditation. Discussion was held with the intent to bring NU FRDAT into the state in a full capacity.
