Suffolk County Police Academy to incorporate comprehensive Disability Awareness Training into curriculum.


On September 28th, Suffolk County Police Commissioner Timothy D. Sini and Legislator DuWayne Gregory, County Chairman held a press conference with NU's Project Director David Whalen to announce the incorporation of the entire law enforcement disability awareness curriculum into the training for all recruits, effective immediately.

This will be the first academy in the nation to have police officers be educated in all disabilities that may challenge them in the line of duty.

DCJS MPTC Adds Niagara University's FR DAT Course to Basic Training

The NYS Division of Criminal Justice Services has approved the expansion of the Basic Course for new recruits to include the full comprehensive training for all new officers. NYS will be the first state in the nation to mandate that training cover all disabilities police

officers may encounter. Niagara University's program will also provide community resources, information to further education, and on-going development of new materials.

NU FR DAT will work in conjunction with its partner, the New York State Justice Center to ensure that trainers will be well-versed in the topic area and able to deliver the material with deeper insight.

NU FR DAT moves forward in Missouri and Montana

Program Director Dave Whalen will be travelling to Missouri the first week of October to begin the customization of first responder curriculum. Dave will meet with leaders in law enforcement, 911 operations, fire suppression, emergency medical services, and the disability community to introduce the program, move forward on state accreditation, and begin identifying training locations and dates.



Dave will also be in Montana in mid-October providing the Train the Trainer program for all four disciplines. The law enforcement training has been accredited, and the 911 dispatch and EMS programs are in the process of being approved.
